# **FEI RULES**

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION •

- Exhibitors are responsible for having their respective Federations declare their horses for the FEI competition BEFORE the close of entries as listed in the FEI Draft Schedules for each week. For 2020, the athletes respective Federation weekly declaration IS THE AUTOMATIC NOMINATION INTO THE #9999 JOG CLASS. The athlete must manually withdraw (with Federation or in the Horse Show Office) any horse they do not plan to show (incorrectly nominated by their Federation) by 4:00 pm Sunday the week prior to the competition to avoid paying the \$675 "no-show" fee as stated in the approved FEI schedule.
- We ask that you ONLY declare the number of horses that are allowed in FEI each week; ie., please don't have your Federation declare 6 horses if only 3 are allowed that week. You will be charged \$675 for no shows/late withdrawals after the jog order is posted, for every horse nominated in the Jog Class. This includes the additional horses still in the FEI system exceeding the number that can participate. Proper entries and withdrawals in the Jog Class before the posted order is the sole responsibility of the athlete. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS to this rule.
- The horse show office will determine the entries for each and every FEI week in the jog class based solely off of the Definite Entries submitted on the FEI Entry System for that week. We will allow substitutions made by Federations up until one hour prior to the jog / horse inspection. After that time there will be NO SUBSTITUTIONS.
- Declarations for individual Classes must be done in the Show Office each week on an Official Add/Drop Sheet. All Declarations must be made by 4 p.m. the day before the class is held, unless otherwise specified.
- Declarations after that time MAY be accepted by Management only, and IF accepted will result in that horse going first in the competition in question.

- Responsible party MUST notify the stable office each week BEFORE the jog/stabling time to secure your stall location.
- Horses must be checked in to FEI secure stabling area between 10 am - 11 am Tuesday for Veterinary/Passport pre-check before the horse inspection begins each week. (Unless approved FEI schedule says otherwise)
- \*\* Note there is a webcam and clock posted at the security gate for management and jury to insure compliance.\*\*
- FEI Horse Inspection will take place at Tuesday 12:00 pm of each week in the FEI area, unless otherwise specified. (Please note the U25 and CSIO horse inspections are defined in the definite schedules for these weeks and vary)
- Both HORSE and RIDER MUST be CURRENT FEI members in order to jog present at the Horse Inspection.
- Any changes to jog horse inspection will be posted in the FEI area, Horse Show Offices and Exhibitor Services.

# STANDARD EQUINE HEALTH INFORMATION

# EQUESTRIAN SPORT PRODUCTIONS HAS HAD VACCINATION PROTOCOL IN PLACE SINCE 2013. WE WILL NOW ADHERE TO GR845 IN WHICH:

At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months (180 days) prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

- 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations: name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
- 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds.

These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds.

The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

- 5. A current negative coggins test. Please renew before it expires, and not just before it is necessary to leave the state. It is strongly recommended that all horses be vaccinated for Equine EHV-1 (either modified live or killed vaccine) no sooner than 7 days prior and no later than 180 days prior to entering the show grounds. Most EHV-1 vaccines are only considered effective for 180 days. Check with your veterinarian about which vaccine you use.
- 6. Once the horse leaves the facility you may be required to show a new Statement Of Health upon your return to the facility. Current vaccination against WNV, EEE, WEE, Tetanus and Rabies is strongly recommended
- 7. You should be able to document your horses normal temperature before arrival. Please do not ship horses with elevated temperatures. It is recommended that you establish a log of temperatures taken at least twice daily. If there is an elevated temperature for more than a 24 hour period, please consult your local Veterinarian immediately.
- 8. Every effort should be made to minimize stress and commingling of horses shipped long distances. Extra hours on a horse van, or moving from stable to stable is the fastest way to compromise your horses' and your neighbors horses' health.
- 9. Any horse on the show grounds with a fever of unknown origin or of suspicious origin must be reported to ESP Management. It is always better to err on the side safety. Isolation stalls will either be available on the grounds or at a local veterinary practice if the need arises.
- 10. Please take the time to review equine good hygiene practices and impress its importance to your groom in everyday care.

You will need to present coggins and Flu/Rhino vaccine information before you can pick up back numbers.

## ENTRY FEE: \$500 JOG FORMAT

All horses entered in the International Hunter Derby class must jog for soundness during the Official Jog prior to the start of the first round in order to compete. The Official Jog must be held within 12 hours of the start of the first round. This jog will be run in a manner similar to an FEI jog.

#### STABLING/SCHOOLING

A. All horses competing in the Derby class must be on the competition grounds a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start of the first round of the class.

B. All horses will be monitored and must remain on the competition grounds until the horse is finished competing in the Derby class. Any horse that leaves the premises prior to completing its participation in the Derby class is disqualified.

C. All horses must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless competitionmanagement designates a specific schooling area for derby horses. Riders must wear the horses' competition number while mounted.

#### STANDARD HUNT AND GO FORMAT

A. The Classic Hunter Round, consisting of 7-8 fences with 2 high options, shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going.

B. After the completion of the classic round horses will pick up their pace and pass through a set of markers to begin their handy portion of the class. The Handy Hunter Round, consisting of 5-8 fences with 2 high options, shall be judged on quality, movement,

jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace, brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. A horse/rider may not jump decorations or other obstacles in order to create a shorter track.

C. Two scores will be given by each judging panel, with one score for the Classic Round and one score for the Handy Round. Bonus points of one point per high option jump will be added to each judging panel's score. The scores from each panel will be added together to determine the total score and placement. Prior to the start of the class one judging panel must be designated as the tie breaker.

D. A judging assistant must be present during all phases of the competition. The duties of the judging assistant include notifying the Judges if a rail comes down and when a horse jumps the higher height option fences. The judging assistant is not required to be a licensed official and is not responsible for the scoring of the judging panels. A competition staff member may fill this role.

E. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point for each higher height option fence jumped must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse- and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence.



## **ENTRY FEE: \$500 JOG FORMAT**

All horses entered in the International Hunter Derby class must jog for soundness during the Official Jog prior to the start of the first round in order to compete. The Official Jog must be held within 12 hours of the start of the first round. This jog will be run in a manner similar to an FEI jog.

## STABLING/SCHOOLING

A. All horses competing in the Derby class must be on the competition grounds a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start of the first round of the class.

B. All horses will be monitored and must remain on the competition grounds until the horse is finished competing in the Derby class. Any horse that leaves the premises prior to completing its participation in the Derby class is disqualified.

C. All horses must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless competitionmanagement designates a specific schooling area for derby horses. Riders must wear the horses' competition number while mounted.

### STANDARD HUNT AND GO FORMAT

A. The Classic Hunter Round, consisting of 7-8 fences with 2 high options, shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going.

B. After the completion of the classic round horses will pick up their pace and pass through a set of markers to begin their handy portion of the class. The Handy Hunter Round, consisting of 5-8 fences with 2 high options, shall be judged on quality, movement,

jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace, brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. A horse/rider may not jump decorations or other obstacles in order to create a shorter track.

C. Two scores will be given by each judging panel, with one score for the Classic Round and one score for the Handy Round. Bonus points of one point per high option jump will be added to each judging panel's score. The scores from each panel will be added together to determine the total score and placement. Prior to the start of the class one judging panel must be designated as the tie breaker.

D. A judging assistant must be present during all phases of the competition. The duties of the judging assistant include notifying the Judges if a rail comes down and when a horse jumps the higher height option fences. The judging assistant is not required to be a licensed official and is not responsible for the scoring of the judging panels. A competition staff member may fill this role.

E. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point for each higher height option fence jumped must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse- and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence.

The teams are made up of 1 professional/ Grand Prix rider, 2 Junior/Amateur riders (The team can have 2 Amateurs, or 2 Juniors or 1 Amateur and 1 Junior)

The course will be made up of 3 consecutive courses, 7 obstacles at 1.10 followed by 7 obstacles at 1.20 followed by 7 obstacles at 1.30. It will be judged as one course of 21 obstacles under Table III faults converted with 2 seconds added for each knock down.

Rider one goes through the start and completes the 1.10 course the next rider starts when rider ones horse lands after the last fence the next rider goes around the 1.20 course and once they land after the last fence the professional goes around the 1.30 course and crosses the final finish line.

The team with the fastest time over the 21 fences will be the winner.

The band will play a 45 second intro while the riders become acclimated with the ring and set in their ready positions.

Please note that we need all teams to enter at the instruction of staff and exit promptly after the completion of their round. We are holding the next team up from entering the ring until all horses have cleared the ring chute. After leaving the chute please go left.

**COSTUME GUIDELINES:** Please note that Management reserves the right to ask riders to remove any part of their costumes which are considered unsafe while competing (examples include capes, anything that obstructs vision or scares horses, etc). We highly encourage team sprit and fun, but safety needs to be paramount.

All costume judging to take place during the event pre-party, from 5 to 6 PM in Special Events.

## RIDERS ARE NOT TO START DURING THE INITIAL 45 SECOND MUSIC SET

At the conclusion of the music set, the tone will be immediately sounded and the countdown clock will start at 15 seconds. If the countdown clock reaches the end of the 15 seconds without a start, the timer will automatically begin. The professional must jump the 1.30 course but the team can decide who jumps the 1.10 and 1.20 courses.

#### CLASS SCORING CLARIFICATIONS:

2 seconds added for each rail.

4 seconds added total for a refusal with knockdown.

5 seconds will be added in the event the next team member in sequence leaves the ground jumping fence #8 or #15 before the previous team member's horse's front two feet land from fence# 7 or #14 respectively. The ground Judges at Fence #7 and fence #14 will signal the landing of the fence by raising a red flag.

20 seconds will be added for any fall of a horse or rider. The clock will stop. A tone will be sounded when it is safe for the next team member to take over in the course where the previous team member fell.

15 seconds will be added for any fall of a horse or rider. The clock will stop. A tone will be sounded when it is safe for the next team member to take over in the course where the previous team member fell.

Each team rider is permitted only two refusals. The 1.10 or the 1.20 team rider is eliminated for two refusals and or fall of horse or rider: If this takes place, it is the next team member in sequence that is responsible for taking over in the course where the previous team member left off. If the professional is eliminated for two refusals or fall, unfortunately the team will not receive a score.

Holding Area Safety- For the past several years there has been too many people on the ground around the horses prior to the teams going in the ring. In the interest of safety, with the exception of a single team captain and 1 groom per horse we will be requiring everone else to remain behind the barrier fences. This is for both before the round and after the round. The teams will be responsible for any of these violations anddd can be accessed a one second penalty by Management or officials for any vioation. This is in the interest of everyone's saftety so please make sure all of your ground support are aware of these rules.

The decision of the ground jury and/or managemnent is final.

## **JUMPER DIVISION NOMINATION FEE - \$250**

## Jumper classes listed will be held at all WEF shows except where otherwise noted

Nomination Fee & Eligibility: To be eligible for the Jumper Division horses must be nominated and the nominating fee of \$250 paid by the closing date of entries. Horses nominated after that date will pay a nominating fee of \$350. Once a horse is nominated, he becomes eligible to compete in the following sections: Jumper 1.50m, 1.45m, 1.40m, 1.35m, 1.30m, Amateur-Owner Jumper, Adult Amateur Jumper, Junior Jumper, Children's Jumper, Children's Modified Jumper, Adult Amateur Modified Jumper and all special classes held in the Jumper Division, if otherwise eligible.

**Courses:** All courses may consist of any combination of the following: brush, gates, oxers, planks and rails, water, liverpool, ditch, wall, and panels.

**Declarations:** Horses must be declared for their class no later than 4:00 p.m. the day before the class is to be held, except where otherwise stated.

Starting Order: Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF Rule JP 112.2 Schooling, Tack & Equipment, Conduct & Attire: According to the FEI and WEF General Regulations and USEF Rules except where otherwise noted. #### **All Horse exempt from Nomination Fees**

Declarations to compete must be made no later than 4:00 p.m. the day before the class is to be held. Any class with 3 or fewer entries as of 4:00 p.m. of the day prior to the class may be canceled at management's discretion. Draw reins and standing martingales are not permitted. All Developing Jumper classes will be held in accordance with JP116.

**Hind Boots:** Non-weighted (maximum of 350g) hind ankle boots are permitted in classes restricted to 5 and 6 year-olds. Support wraps are permitted. If boots are made of rigid leather or plastic, they may only be a maximum of 6 inches/15 cm in height. All classes are subject to the current rules for DJS Finals. A green pony is a pony of any age not exceeding 14.2 hands that has not been shown over fences the regulation height or higher for its respective section (2'3" for small, 2'6" for medium and 2'9" for large) prior to December 1st of the current competition year at a Regular Competition of USEF or Equine Canada or any national or international competition. Showing in Canada over fences at or higher than the regulation height for the pony's section under Equine Canada rules breaks the pony's green status for the purpose of this Article and Federation rules whether or not the regulation height for the pony's section under Equine Canada rules is less than, equal to, or greater than the regulation height for the pony's section under Federation rules. Ponies who have not broken their Green Status must jump less than their regulation height in open classes or their Green Status will be broken. Once a pony has broken its green status in one Hunter Pony section (i.e., small, medium, large) it will not regain its green status by moving into another Hunter Pony section. If a competition starts prior to or on November 30, Green Pony status at the start of the competition is maintained throughout the competition. A pony's green status is considered to be broken once it competes over fences the regulation height or higher for its respective section (see above). The pony's green status may be reinstated for a future competition year if it was not shown at more than four (4) competitions prior to September 1st. The time allowed for a 3\* will be figured at 375 meters per minute, if arena size permits.

The time must be manually or electronically timed for 1\* and 2\* USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENTSEARCH CLASS.

The time must be electronically timed for 3\* USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH CLASS.

The Jumping phase of the class shall be held prior to the Flat phase over a Junior Jumper styled course with a minimum of ten numbered fences at the respective heights, spreads, and other obstacles as delineated below.

- a. (1\*) Fence heights will be 1.10m to 1.15m (3'7" to 3'9") with a minimum of three (3) spreads (as defined in JP125), excluding triple bar (if any). The course must include one (1) double and one (1) triple combination (or three (3) doubles), and at least one (1) Liverpool covered with water.
- b. (2\*) Fence heights will be 1.15m (3'9") with a minimum of three (3) spreads (as defined in JP 125), excluding triple bar (if any) and water obstacle. The course must include one (1) double and one (1) triple combination (or three (3) doubles), one (1) water-filled Liverpool, and a water-filled water jump (minimum 2.45m (8') with an option fence.) The water must have a rail over it and must be colored black or blue so the bottom is not visible.

The course must include one (1) double and one (1) triple combina- tion (or three (3) doubles), one (1) water-filled Liverpool, and a dug in water-filled open water jump of 3.05m to 3.65m (10' to 12') with or without a rail over it, at the judge's discretion in consultation with the Course Designer, a rail may be added over the water in the interest of safety to the competitors. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-19. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class. Approximately thirty riders will be invited to compete in the finals and will be chosen as follows; the high point rider in each of the regional series will be invited, along with additional riders working from the top down on the National Standings list for the qualifying period. Any unfilled slots will be chosen by continuing down the National Standings list.

Open to all Junior members of the USEF and Equine Canada who have never competed in any of the following: National Equitation Final with fences at 3'6": Pessoa/US Medal; ASPCA Maclay; USEF Talent Search (East or West); Jump Canada Medal Finals; WIHS Junior Equitation Finals; Hunterdon Cup; North American Equitation Championship. To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-17. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class. Approximately forty riders will be invited to compete in the finals and will be chosen as follows; the high point rider in each of the regional series will be invited, along with additional riders working from the top down on the National Standings list for the qualifying period Any unfilled slots will be chosen by continuing down the National Standings list

The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. USEF Tests 1-17. To fill a THIS NHS Medal three (3) competitors must complete the course.

#### 3090 WIHS EQUITATION CLASS 3091 IS HUNTER PHASE CLASS 3092 IS JUMPER PHASE.

#### Entry Fee: \$75 per phase

Trophy & 8 Ribbons for Overall & Each Phase

Open to Junior members of USEF or Equine Canada. Three riders must complete the course for class to count. The same horse must be used in all phases. One rider per horse unless the judge requests otherwise. Classes to be judged in accordance with the current USEF standards for equitation. Riders may only compete in one WIHS Equitation class at a show. Splitting of classes must be in accordance with USEF EQ 106.3. Annual membership must be received by WIHS within 10 days of the event to earn points in the rankings. Membership application online at www.ryegate.com.

- **I. Hunter Phase class 3091:** Conventional tack per USEF EQ 105.5. Change of bridle is permissible between phases. To be shown over a minimum of 8 jumps at 3'6". It is recommended that the course be a straightforward hunter course consisting of natural jumps, including a combination, hunter lines and a long approach to a single jump. A numerical score will be given for the first round only. Further testing will be optional. USEF tests 1-17. Trophy & Eight Ribbons for Hunter Phase
- II. Jumper Phase class 3092: There are no restrictions on saddles. Change of bridle is permissible between phases. Blinkers are forbidden. Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted in the jumper phase. Reins must be attached to the bit(s) or directly to the bridle. Gags and hackamores are permitted. The course should be of the type used in a Junior or Preliminary Jumper competition. To be shown over a minimum of 10 jumps at 3'6". A minimum of two double or one triple combination are required. There must be at least two changes of direction after the first fence. In addition, at least two of the following are required and more are recommended: vertical — no ground lines, liverpool, narrow jump — minimum width 8', one or more of the following — triple bar, swedish oxer, fan jump. Although the jumper phase is timed, judging commences when the rider actually enters the ring and therefore before the rider passes through the start markers which will begin their time for the course. Judging concludes when the rider exits the ring. A Time Allowed based on the speed of 360 y/min. The judge will give a numerical score for each competitor's round. The announcer will announce the judge's numerical score then deduct time faults as follows: one point for each commenced second over the Time Allowed. Management may elect to hold the Jumper Phase as a Table Sec 1. 2(c) - Power and Speed competition, in which the Time Allowed will apply only in the 'speed' phase and must be computed at 382 y/min. Run in accordance with EQ106.3. Further testing is optional. USEF tests 1-17. Trophy & Eight Ribbons for Jumper Phase III. Two Phase Event - Hunter & Jumper: Each class will have separate Hunter and Jumper Phase. Each Phase will be conducted under the specifications detailed above. Both Hunter & Jumper Phases to be scored under the numerical system in the first round. First round scores from each phase will be added together to determine the winner. In the event of a tie for first place in the overall score, the judge of the second phase must resolve the tie by further testing (USEF tests 1-17). Ties in each phase must be resolved by the Judge's decision without further testing. Ties for other than first place in either phase or overall must be resolved by Judge's decision. Scores from the first phase will determine the order of go in the second phase. The highest scores will return last; riders may volunteer to move up in the order. One or more judges may be used in any combination. Rider must compete in both phases to be eligible for an overall award.

#### 3093 WIHS PONY EQUITATION

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & 8 Ribbons

WIHS Pony Equitation is open to USEF and Equine Canada member shows that request an application to hold an equitation qualifier class. To be shown over a course of not less than 6 obstacles. Fence heights: 2'3" for ponies not exceeding 12.2 hands; 2'6" for ponies over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 13.2 hands; and 3' for ponies over 13.2 hands and not exceeding 14.2 hands. If an in and out is used, the suggested distance for small ponies is 20', for medium ponies is 22' and for large ponies is 24'. The distance must be altered for each height division. A maximum of 20 riders may be asked to return to show at the walk, trot and canter and to perform any additional tests at the judges discretion. Conventional tack per USEF EQ 105.5.

#### 3094 DOVER SADDLERY PALM BEACH ADULT MEDAL

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & 8 Ribbons

Open to all Adult Amateur Members of the USEF who have not competed in equitation classes exceeding 3'6" in height at the 2020 Winter Equestrian Festival. All contestants are required to perform over a minimum of 8 fences not exceeding 3'3" with or without wings. A minimum of I2 riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The Flat Phase of those selected shall count 50%. Only one rider per horse. USEF Tests 1-17. Classes offered each week of WEF 1 - 11 will present courses of increasing technicality and fence heights not to exceed 3'3". The top 20 competitors or top 50% (whichever is greater) in WEF standings who have not competed in 2021 equitation classes exceeding 3'6" will qualify for the Final held at WEF 12 on Sunday, WEF 12. We will calculate points in each of the 12 Qualifying classes using the WEF Increment system. 1st Place-7 pts, 2nd Place -5 pts, 3rd Place-4 pts, 4th Place -3 pts, 5th Place -2 pts, 6th Place -1 pt., with a multiplier applied depending on the number of entries in the class. Refer to WEF Circuit Awards for further explanation. Special gifts and final ribbons awarded through 8th place. The rider with the most points in all of the classes for the circuit will receive an additional prize. **Must be a WEF Circuit member to accrue points.** 

#### WEF GENERAL REGULATIONS

#### 1. MEMBERSHIP

- a. WEF Membership is not required to participate at any classes at any of the shows listed in this prize list. However, to be eligible for Circuit Championships provided at the Winter Equestrian Festival horse competitions, each owner must be a current WEF member. The subscription fee is \$50 per individual, \$70 per farm. For Equitation points to count for WEF the rider MUST also be a member of WEF.
- b. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Non-US Citizens (as defined by GR901.9) and Foreign Competitors (as defined by GR828.4) must provide proof in English, of current membership in good standing in their respective National Federation, or hold current membership in good standing with the USEF.

#### 2. CLOSING DATES

a. Jumper nomination fees, hunter fees, equitation fees, and stabling fees will be due according to the following schedule:

a. \*Please note that ALL non FEI stabling fees and reservations (Plan or weekly) are due by Saturday, December 26. The reservation must be made on the official stabling form with signature(s) on the rules acknowledgement page. Please note that weekly reservations may be cancelled if not accompanied with entries received by the closing dates. (See 2.a. above.) Please see Page 12 for Equine Health Information that

- will be required for entry onto the grounds.
- b. Requires that nomination fees, hunter, equitation fees, processing fee, stabling fee or grounds fee, \$35 Horse and Ambulance fee and USEF Drug & Administration fee or FEI Drug Fee accompany each entry blank. We will not accept blank checks for closing date payments. Entries will be processed only when accompanied by payment of the above fees. Make all checks payable to Equestrian Sport Productions, LLC. in United States Funds. Entry blanks must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent, trainer, riders, and/or coach. Acknowledgments will not be mailed.

#### 3. ENTRIES AND NOMINATIONS

- a. Entries for all hunter and equitation classes close according to the above schedule. A \$50 per horse post entry fee will be assessed if the entry is received before the show starts. After the show starts entries will be accepted the day of the class at management's discretion. A post entry charge of \$40 per class or \$125 per hunter section per show will apply. Divisions with less than (4) four entries as of 4:00 p.m. the night before the division starts will be combined, and will remain combined regardless of entries received after that time. Management also reserves the right to combine divisions prior to their start if scratches decrease the number of horses competing to less than (4) four in any section. All entries and nominations must be completed on proper written forms in the office or by ShowGroundsLive online before 4:00 p.m. the night before. Any other forms of entries will not be accepted. This includes text messages.
- b. Nominations for all Jumper Sections and classes close according to the above schedule or as otherwise noted. Post nominations will be accepted after the closing date at the regular nominating fee plus a late charge of \$125 unless otherwise stated. After the show starts entries will be accepted the day of the class at management's discretion.
- c. Declarations to show horses which have been nominated for the Jumper Division must be made during Competition Office hours (See Rule No. 16) and received by the Competition Secretary no later than 4:00 p.m. the day before the class is held unless otherwise noted. At management's discretion entries received after 4:00 pm may be accepted and a late fee of \$50 per class will be assessed for all classes other than Grand Prix, Challenge Cup and Classic declarations.
- d. Late or improper Grand Prix/Challenge Cup/Classic declarations: Declarations received after the published deadline or declarations improperly completed will be accepted at management's discretion. A penalty of \$100 per \$10,000 class or less; \$150 per \$25,000 - \$36,000 class; \$175 per \$50,000 class; \$200 per \$75,000; \$300 per \$100,000 or more may be assessed. In the event of acceptance of a late declaration where a Starting Order is established, the declared entrant will be placed prior to the #1 position in the Starting Order.
- e. Horses competing in classes that they have not been entered in the office on the official add/drop form (there is no adding at the gate) all adds that come off of any judge's card will be required to pay \$75 per class.
- g. USEF & USHJA: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$23.00 per competition (\$15.00 Drugs & Medication, \$8.00 USEF), and a \$7.00 per horse, per competition USHJA Zone support fee. All owners, senior, junior, amateur, adult amateur riders, trainers and coaches are required to present the actual or a copies of their USEF /USHJA membership

card to the Competition Secretary. Failure to present a USEF card will result in having to pay show pass fees. Junior and pony hunters must present their measurement cards at the Competition Office before numbers may be picked up. To speed processing, please send a copy of your card(s) with your entry forms. All ponies and junior hunters that do not possess a current measurement card must be measured prior to competing in those classes in which a measurement card is required. Time and place of measurement stations will be announced. Anyone not a member of USEF and/or USHJA will be charged a \$45 show pass fee for USEF and \$30 for USHJA. For membership info go to www.USEF.org or www.USHJA.org.

- h. USEF IHP Fees: All horses competing in any FEI sanctioned classes and all USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prix during WEF are subject to USEF International High Performance fee in accordance with GR207. A \$35 per horse fee will be assessed for each horse on a per class basis.
- i. FEI Registration Fees and Show Fees: All horses and riders competing in a FEI recognized competition must have a FEI Rider Registration Number and a Horse Registration Number. Fee is \$15 per horse and \$15 per rider annually. go to www.usef.org. A \$33 FEI fee will be billed to any horse competing in an FEI competition. This will be in lieu of the \$23 USEF fee.
- The owner as listed on the entry form will be responsible for all entry fees, nomination fees, and stabling fees of all horses entered or nominated on the entry form.
- k. If necessary to meet time schedule requirements and preserve a balance with entries in other divisions, Management reserves the right to limit the number of entries in each division. If entries are limited, horses will be accepted based on a first come, first serve basis. Management also reserves the right to combine or cancel classes due to insufficient entries. Management reserves the right to revise the schedule if needed.
- I. A fine of \$150 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable funds. This includes checks and credit cards that are declined. This also includes all Disputed Charges. If you are planning disputing a charge please email the detail to jglosson@equestriansport.com. Foreign competitors must pay in U.S. Funds
- m. Office Fees:
  - \$75 Office Fee This will be charged to all horses per week \$50 Grounds Fee - all horses NOT paying a stall fee to ESP, LLC for any given week will be assessed this fee.
- n. All accounts must be settled weekly by one hour after the completion of competition, (unless prior arrangements are made) after which time a closeout fee of \$10 will apply. If you leave an open check for your entry fees and do not come in to close out your bill, we will fill out the amount due and present your check for payment. You have until one hour after the close of the competition to view your bill. If you dispute any charges on your bill you must bring it to our attention during this time period. After this time period all bills will remain final. Online closeout is available. If you have an open balance for more than 7 days you may be prohibited from further showing until the balance is cleared.

#### o. Show Pass Fees

For those exhibitors who are not current members of the USEF a \$45 fee for USEF and \$30 for USHJA will be added to each entry. In addition each horse regardless of whether the owner is a current member of the USEF

or USHJA must pay a \$75 horse registration fee to the USHJA. Forms will be available in the office. You can go to www.ushja.org for more information. Those exempt from these fees are listed in GR901.9 1-9. (Exception: USEF Academy Classes)

#### 4. SCRATCHES

- a) Horses entered in hunter sections, classes or equitation classes must be scratched by written notice and presented to the Competition Secretary. A Veterinarian Certificate is not required. This written notice must be in the possession of the Secretary one hour prior to the start of the hunter section/class scratched. When valid notice of a scratch is received, the entry fee will be credited less a \$75 per hunter section/\$25 per class office processing fee. Once a hunter section has started, horses that are not competing in classes in which they are entered will forfeit their fees unless the horse becomes ill or injured prior to the class or classes in which it is entered. In this case, in order to qualify for a credit, a scratch sheet must be filled out and presented to the Secretary. In addition, an Official Veterinarian Certificate must be filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian, certifying the illness or injury, and presented to the Secretary no later than one hour after the final class of the competition. Entry fees will then be credited less the processing fee of \$75 per horse.
- b. All classes must be scratched on the official office scratch form and presented to an office staff member before the start of the class. Any other forms of notification will not be accepted. This includes text messaging. Upon timely receipt of the scratch form, the entry fee will be credited.
- c. \$100 of the nomination fee will be refunded to the owners of horses that have been scratched (scratch sheet) twenty-four hours prior to the start of the competition. If the horse is scratched within 24 hours to the start of the ccompetition, an Official Veterinarians Certificate filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian and must be presented to the Secretary prior to the conclusion of the last class of the competition in order to obtain this refund. If a horse is scratched after competing in any class at the competition, no refund of the nominating fee will be given.
- 5. **HUNTER SCORING:** The open numerical hunter scoring system will be used. Alternate methods of judge scoring may be allowed at the discretion of Management.
- **6. COURTESY CIRCLE:** Management reserves the right to limit the Courtesy Circle in Hunter and Equitation classes in accordance with USEF HU110.2.
- 7. HORS CONCOURS: No horses or ponies will be allowed in any jumper, hunter or equitation class 'hors concours' during the competition.
- 8. COMPETITION RING ACCESS: Horses will not be allowed in the competition rings for schooling before competition hours with the exception of warm-up days. Hand walking of horses may be permitted at management's discretion.
- **9. NUMBERS:** Competitors competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion. Numbers are assigned as per the official entry form and any change that is not documented by a properly signed change form will be a misrepresentation of the identity of the entry and a violation of USEF rules. European Numbers are not allowed as the only number. The official number

#### provided by the office must also be used.

**10. EVENTS SCHEDULED**: Management reserves the right to change scheduled classes at any of our venues to a different ring or venue ie. The Stadium for any reason, inclement weather, time constraints or any other reason the management decides is best for the horses' well being and competition.

#### 11. ATTIRE

Refer to Attire Section in the Jumper Section of this prize list

- a. Appropriate dress is required in all classes.
- b. Formal attire: Jumpers As required by USEF and FEI rules.
- Formal attire: Riders are required to wear scarlet or dark coats; white shirts with white stock; white, buff or canary breeches and ASTM approved headgear See GR801.
- d. Jumper riders may wear breeches and solid colored polo shirts unless otherwise noted in the prize list.
- e. All persons must wear properly fitted protective headgear with a chin strap that passes or surpasses ASTM/SEI standards while mounted anytime on the competition grounds. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ATSM/SEI) and/or a protective safety vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport competition that meets or surpasses the current ASTM standard in any division or class without penalty form the judge. The Federation recommends that the vest meet or surpass the current ASTM standard or be certified by the Safety Equipment Institute. (USEF GR 801.3, 4, 5, 6, & 7)
- f. No mounted exhibitor may wear or carry an electronic communication device (i.e., cellular telephone, pager, walkie talkie, etc.) Ear buds are also prohibited while mounted. The penalty for wearing or carrying a forbidden device if observed by an official may be eliminated from the class during which the device was worn or carried. Exception: A handicapped participant may use electronic devices if, prior to the class, he/she presents to the USEF Steward written justification from treating personnel setting forth the necessity of the equipment.
- g. EQUUS Foundation arm bands have been approved as optional attire for all classes at Equestrian Sport Productions horse shows.
- 12. AWARD CEREMONIES: Riders are required to ride for awards in all Classic/Grand Prix and Team competitions, unless notice of ceremony cancellation has been given. Failure of a rider to be present may result in forfeiture of all prizes won in the class. Competition management reserves the right to require participation in any tie-breaking procedure in order to determine a winner of a competition or championship. Refusal to participate in the tie-break proceedure (if required) may include, but is not limited to; forfeiture of prize money and/or elimination from the competition. The decision of management is final.
- 13. ORDERS OF GO: Produced in accordance with Federation Rules JP 112 and HU125. Riders and trainers who have conflicts due to classes in more than one ring at the same time should see the Starter or Technical Coordinator so that necessary adjustments can be made. At no time will any ring be held up over 3 minutes due to conflicts.

#### 14. STABLING

 a. Competing out of a van or a truck parked on the competition grounds is prohibited. Entries are hereby warned that those caught unloading on Equestrian Club Drive or anywhere on grounds without assigned

#### stalls may be eliminated from the competition.

- b. All horses competing in CSIs & CSIO during the Winter Equestrian Festival are required to be on grounds AND stabled in the official FEI Stable Area according to the draft schedule for each week.
- c. Right of Entry to FEI Stable Area will be provided to riders, grooms, trainers and owners with proper credentials. Individuals will be issued credentials (photo ID) prior to entering the FEI Stable Area. Credentials may be obtained at the Exhibitor Services Center.
- d. Horses entered in CSIs & CSIO classes must wear the number assigned to them for the competition, at all times upon leaving the stable area.
- e. Any horse/rider combination(s) found in violation of rules 14c & or 14d may be disqualified from the class in which the violation occurred and shall forfeit the entry fee.
- f. All NON FEI horses may begin arriving on the Monday before the start of competition from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. For other arrangements please contact the Stabling Manager.
- g. Horses and equipment will be admitted to the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Anyone wishing to arrive prior to the above dates or at some other hour must make special arrangements with the Stabling Supervisor. (561) 784-1134.
- WEF Boarding Packages- No refunds on any stalls or Stall Packages.
   Subletting is not permitted. Please note that no structures may be placed outside of the tent structures.
- Weekly Boarding WEF Series: Canvas stalls with doors provided and installed on a grass floor will be a cost of \$425 plus tax for National Stalls for weeks 1-8 and \$375 for weeks 9-12. FEI Horses are \$675 as per the draft schedule "showing fee" FEI horses not withdrawn by the closing date specified in the draft schedule will be charged the \$675 No Show/Not Withdrawn Fee. Weekly stalls must be reserved and paid in full by December 28. Reservations received after the deadline will be accepted if any stalls remain. We reserve the right to place your stalls any place on any ESP property depending on availability. (Limited availability)
- WEF Boarding Plans are offered at a significant discount. For boarding documents log on to www.pbiec.coth. com (listed under Competitors-Stabling options) or call Tom Blankenship @ 561-784-1134.
- \*Please note that ALL non FEI stabling fees and reservations (Plan
  or weekly) are due by <u>Saturday</u>, <u>December 26</u>. The reservation must
  be made on the official stabling form with signature(s) on the rules
  acknowledgement page. Please note that weekly reservations may
  be cancelled if not accompanied with entries received by the closing
  dates. See 2(a) for a list of closing dates. Please refer to the Equine
  Health Information that will be required for entry onto the grounds.
- Permanent Stalls if available will be available for use on a "show" basis only. From Tuesday to Sunday (No Layovers) for the price of \$700 per stall. Permanent stalls have a compact sand floor with mats.
- For all other dates not listed above please contact the Stabling Supervisor at (561) 784-1134 to make arrangements.
- i. A charge of \$50 per competition will be added for each stall reserved after the closing date of entries December 28 if stalls are available.
- j. Initial bedding will not be provided unless otherwise stated.

- k. Unless special arrangements are made with Management, stalls must be vacated no later than 12:00 noon the day following the conclusion of each competition.
- I. Stall fees are not refundable under any circumstances.
- m. BMP MANURE AND WASTE MUST BE PLACED IN THE DESIGNATED CONTAINER AREAS ONLY. HORSES MAY ONLY BE WASHED IN PERMANENT WASH AREAS PROVIDED BY ESP. FINES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE MAY BE APPLIED.
- n. A Non-Stabling/ Grounds fee of \$50 will be charged to all horses not paying ESP for stalls. (Subletting stalls is not allowed)
- 15. SCHOOLING CSIS & CSIO CLASSES: All schooling for these classes shall be held under the inspection of the Steward/Schooling Supervisor in the designated schooling area. Designated schooling areas and schooling hours will be posted in the Competition Office and the FEI Stable Area.
- **16. COURSES:** In all jumper classes, courses may consist of any combination of the following: brush, gates, oxers, rails, planks, water, liverpool, ditch, wall and panels. In all hunter classes, fences will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in-andout, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, bank and panels.

#### 17. COMPETITION OFFICE HOURS

a. Competition days - Opens one hour before the start of the first class and closes immediately following the last class or 5:00 p.m. whichever is later. (Unless otherwise posted.) Non Competition Days: Mondays closed; Tuesdays 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Declarations for classes will not be accepted after 4:00 p.m.

#### 18. ACCOUNT SETTLEMENT & REFUND & CREDIT CARD POLICY

- a. All accounts must be settled in full no later than one hour after the last class on the last day of each scheduled competition (unless prior arrangements are made) See Office Fees.
- b Refund and Credit Card Policy
  - Stabling, nominating and administration fees will not be refunded under any circumstances. Horses entered may be scratched without a veterinarian's certificate by notifying the Show Secretary in writing on an official scratch sheet. Written notification is received before the start of competition, entry fees will be refunded, less a \$150 processing fee. We encourage you or your agent/trainer to close out your show bill in person before the end of the show. However, if you do not do so in person, you automatically agree to authorize Equestrian Sports Productions to charge your credit card for all entry fees, stabling fees, etc. If you dispute a charge made by Equestrian Sports Productions you may not be able to show until the charge dispute has been resolved.
- c. Stabling, nominating and administration fees will not be refunded under any circumstances. Horses entered may be scratched without a veterinarian's certificate by notifying the Show Secretary in writing via letter, official scratch sheet, or other written correspondence. provided: Written notification is received before the start of competition, entry fees will be refunded, less a \$150 processing fee. We encourage you or your agent/trainer to close out your show bill in person before the end of the show. However, if you do not do so in person, you automatically agree to authorize Equestrian

- Sport Productions to charge your credit card for all entry fees, stabling fees, etc. If you dispute a charge made by Equestrian Sport Productions you may not be able to show until the charge dispute has been resolved.
- d. TRAINERS WILL BE HELD FINANCIALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY CLIENTS WHO DO NOT SUBMIT VIABLE PAYMENT IN A TIMELY MANNER.

#### 19. BACK NUMBERS

a. One back number per horse will be assigned at the 2021 Winter Equestrian Festival. As per GR908.2, A signature is required on each entry blank for each rider that rides that horse. This signature is the sole responsibility of the Rider. Those found riding an entry while displaying a back number assigned to others from the E.S.P. show office, without first having the new rider's signature attached to that entry, assuring the owner's consent to ride, as well as agreeing to all the rules of the competition and the Federation, will be considered in noncompliance as described in GR908.3 and will be disqualified from the class, competition and will not be allowed to show in any further competitions until an entry blank is signed properly. Back numbers must be worn by the horse that has the corresponding microchip number. Management bears no responsibility or liability to anyone who has not signed the waiver. Any fines or other actions by the Federation, will be the full responsibility of the violator for exhibiting with a back number issued to others, for misrepresenting the identity of the entry, and for failing to sign the entry as per the rules of the Federation and the competition. Rider hereby agrees to this full responsibility and any damages that may come from this action.

#### **20. PRIZE MONEY**

- a. Prize money will be credited to the entry's show account after the results of the class winnings are posted or a check will be mailed to the owner at the address on the entry blank within thirty days after the show, thereby ending the show's responsibility as long as all criteria has been met. You must provide a completed tax form containing a social security number or Federal TIN for the Prize Money recipient. If one is not provided then prize money will be withheld until one is provided. This number must match the prize money payee. If you do not denote a prize money recipient the prize money will automatically go to the owner. Any class that has a number of entries required will have the payout based on the number of on time entries. Classes that do not have enough entries to pay out prize money will either be cancelled, or run without prize money at the exhibitors option. FEI Prize money will be distributed to the Chefs d'Equipe or to the winning Owners, lessees or competitors not later than immediately after the last Competition of the Event provided they have met all their financial and other obligations to the Horse Show. Any excess prize money will be mailed to the prize money participant.
- b. Prize Money Won by Foreign Competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors requesting a treaty exemption need to have an Federal Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN, SS#, TIN), and will be required to complete a form W-8BEN, W-8BEN-E indicating the Article number

of the treaty exemption, or a form W-8ECI (no Article number required). If your treaty allows for a certain gross amount to be won before witholding is taken 30% of your prize money will be held on account until your total amount of prize money can be calculated. The forms will be available at the Show Office or can be downloaded at www.irs.gov. We strongly advise competitors to consult their tax advisor in advance of the circuit.

- c. Lost or stolen prize money checks will be reissued only after a 180 day waiting period from the original check date has passed. In the event of unauthorized redeeming of a check, Equestrian Sport Productions, LLC will provide check copies to exhibitors and will be held harmless from the collection process.
- **21. FARRIER:** No farrier other than the official competition farrier will be permitted to shoe on the grounds without the express permission of the Management. Exhibitors wishing to use another farrier must request a permit for that farrier at the Stabling Office 561-784-1134.
- **22. FEED, HAY & BEDDING:** Gold Coast Feed & Nutrition is the Official provider of feed and bedding at the horse show. Call 561-793-4607 to place your order. NO OTHER VENDORS WILL BE ALLOWED TO DELIVER ON THE SHOWGROUNDS.
- 23. VEHICLES & DESIGNATED PARKING: All trucks, autos, golf carts and other motorized vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. To insure the safety of all exhibitors, any motorized vehicles (electric or gasoline) on the competition grounds must be operated by persons with a valid drivers license All motorized vehicles must be registered with the Show Office and must contain a 2020 WEF Parking Decal. Any unregistered vehicle will be will be towed. Limited reserved parking will be available for stall holders only for \$150 each on a first come/first serve basis. Management reserves the right to charge a fee for horse trailer storage. All trailer storage will be off site and may be restricted and or not provided at the discretion of management. <u>USEF Motorized Vehicle Statement</u>: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe"

use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**24. DOGS/PETS:** Dogs/Pets are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs/pets on a leash while mounted. Dog/Pet owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards. GR1301.6 Any dog/pet that is found loose will be detained by the show until a fine is paid. Any dog /pet that disrupts an exhibitor's round will be required to pay the exhibitor for that round plus a \$100 fine to the show. Also, please dispose of all dog/pet waste in the proper containers. Management reserves the right to evict and/or bar future entry to any dog (or pet) that displays aggressive behavior towards people or other animals. Dog or pet owners will be held financially and legally responsible for any injuries caused by their pets.

**25. HEALTH CERTIFICATES:** FL regulations require that all equines be covered by official interstate health certificates, issued by a licensed veterinarian, showing that the animals are free from any symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease. The certificate shall include the name of the owner and address, destination in FL, number of horses examined, the name, registration number(s), if any, tattoo, if any, sex, age, rectal temperature, color, and markings of each animal listed. Health certificates will become void after 30 days from issue. Heath certificates must show animals to be negative to an equine infectious anemia test withithe past 180 days. Date of test and approved laboratory must be shown on health certificate. Equine Rhinopneuonitis vaccination is not required; however, if any animal is vaccinated, it is ineligible for entry within 7 days of vaccination. Vehicles transporting animals must have certificates showing that it was cleaned and disinfected under veterinary supervision prior to loading. This information can be written on the health certificate.

26. MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste. Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. Sharps will be placed in sharp containers provided. Anyone found discarding sharps in any other manner will be fined up to \$250 per instance and held responsible for any fines or expenses incurred by management. Violations to this rule will be dealt with very seriously. Improper disposal of sharps poses a serious health threat to anyone who may come in contact with it. Please make sure that anyone who handles these sharps on your behalf are aware of the responsibility involved. Neither ignorance or language will excuse fine enforcement. If you need additional containers or any assistance with the disposal of sharps, please ask the office or a member of the staff. Only those stabled on-site are able to use our sharps containers. Dumping sharps from Off-Site barns or stalls will not be tolerated. Thank you for your cooperation.

27. LIABILITY

- a. Equestrian Sport Productions, LLC, Gold Coast Feed, Grand Prix Village at the Equestrian Club, Wellington Equestrian Partners, LLC., Littlewood Fences, Inc., Palm Beach International Equestrian Center, and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectators, quest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at any of the competition.
- b. FL Senate Bill 1658 Equine Zero Liability Statute: Warning Under FL Law an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities. Also see FL Equine Activity Statute - FL Statutes Title XLV TORTS Chapter 773 Equine Activities.
- c. "All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date."
- 28. DISPUTES: Should any question arise that is not provided for in the rules, the same shall be referred to the competition committee whose decision shall be final. In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.
- 29. WEF GENERAL & ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY: Upholding the welfare of the horses exhibited here is of primary concern to Equestrian Sport Productions, LLC. We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subject to mistreatment. Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents, must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses, whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose. At all times for horses competing at the WEF we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing the rules of the U.S. Equestrian, Inc. which pertain to the welfare of the horse. Exhibitors are cautioned that GR839 (which defines the Federation policy on abuse), GR843 (which pertains to Poling), and GR803 (which pertains to the Use of Whips), will be strictly enforced. Any handling and veterinary treatment should ensure the health and welfare of the horse. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision will be made for ventilation, feeding and watering and maintaining a healthy environment. Any method of riding and training should take into account the horse as a living entity, and must not include any technique considered to be abusive. The well being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators are subject, under the above rules, to elimination from competition and to protest or charge with resulting formal proceedings which may result in severe fines, suspensions or other penalties. To affirm

- the sport of show jumping to the general public in a positive, humane light, and eliminate those training methods which may be misconstrued, we are maintaining the following policy for all horses competing in the WEF starting one half hour before the first scheduled class of the competition and continuing until the last scheduled class of the competition is completed
- **30. POLING & OFF-SETS:** Manual poling and the use of bamboo offsets are prohibited for all horses competing in the WEF. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition for the duration of the scheduled competition starting from the time of the incident. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo off-sets rule is perpetrated will be suspended from competition for the duration of the scheduled competition. All entry fees for the classes entered during the suspended period of the horse in question will be forfeited.
- 31. COMPORTMENT: Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the Judges or Officials on the part of any owner, rider, trainer, family member, or groom may disqualify the horse and the owner will forfeit all entry and other fees.
- 32. HARD HAT RULE: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards forequestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee must bar riders with out protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience. The Competiton will uphold all rules listed under GR801.
- 33. COMBINING & SPLITTING- Sections that are scheduled as split sections will be combined following current USEF rules. All USEF Federation rules for combining Rated sections will be in affect. If you are interested in sponsorship contact show management the day before the section is started to avoid last minute changes. The show will be in compliance of HU 116 and HU 112-118. Please note classes will not be re-divided after close of entries at 4 p.m. the day before the section starts. Any entry and accepted after the closing time will not be calculated in the minimums for splitting.

#### **34. CHAMPION & RESERVE**

Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in all Hunter Sections. The awards will be made to two of the four horses that have acquired the most points in the over fences classes. In addition to these points, only those four horses shall receive full points for ribbons won in the Under Saddle Class. Points will be awarded on the basis of 10,6,4,2,1,1/2 for lst, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th places respectively. All classes are full point classes, except MODEL classes which are 1/2 point classes. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in all Jumper sections on the basis of points in accordance with JP110.2, Ties to be broken by Highest Placing in the Classic. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in the Equitation Section and in accordance with EQ106.86.a with the top two riders with the most points being eligible.

#### **35. PROTEST**

Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$200 for USEF Members or \$300 for Non-Members with the Show Secretary, or Steward which sum will be forfeited to the show if the same is not sustained. All protests must be addressed to the Show Secretary or Steward and made in writing, signed by the protester, and filed with the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Show Steward within 48 hours. Funds must be payable to USEF. Protests may also be files with the Federation Hearing Committee as outlined in GR603.1.

#### **36. SAFESPORT**

GR1303 Safe Sport Requirements

Consistent with the mission statement of the Federation, the welfare of equestrian participants, especially minors, is of paramount concern. When any member — athlete, participant, trainer, coach, organizer, official, volunteer, or staff member — is subjected to or engages in abuse or misconduct, it undermines the mission of the Federation and is inconsistent with the best interests of equestrian sport and of the athletes the Federation serves. The Safe Sport Policy and U.S. Center for Safe Sport's Code have been created to protect all athletes from mis-

conduct they may experience within sport. The education and training of all participants in equestrian sport is crucial to the protection of athletes, reporting of misconduct, and eradication of abuse in our sport. The U.S. Center for SafeSport (Center) is the first and only national organization of its kind focused on ending all forms of abuse in sport. As an independent non-profit headquartered in Denver, CO, the Center provides consultation to sport entities on prevention techniques and policies, while developing best practices and educational programs focused on promoting athlete wellbeing and putting an end to abuse in sports. The Center also provides a safe, professional, and confidential place for individuals to report sexual abuse.

The Federation Safe Sport Policy defines a "Federation Participant" as any Federation member, or non-member, who participates in or attends a Federation Licensed Competition or sanctioned event. The Federation's Safe Sport Policy can be found at www.usef.org and the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code can be found at www.safesport.org

#### **37. AIR VESTS**

Air vests are allowed (and encouraged) in all disciplines. For Hunter and Equitation Classes. Judges are instructed not to deduct point for the use of an air vest.

Please notethat the show will not be delayed in order to reset the air vests. Riders who choose to wear air vests are therefore strongly encouraged to have spare equipment (air canisters, tethers, and entire vest) so that the vests that have been inflated can quickly be returned to their operation. Please look for canister reclycling containers located at participating air vest vendors.

#### **VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS**

Veterinary Regulations, 10th Edition, effective 1 June 2006

A horse inspection will be scheduled for each week in which FEI competitions are held. Rider's will be notified and notice will be posted in the competition office 24 hours before.

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 22nd Edition, effective 1 June 2007 will apply:

#### Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other Cls, ClOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

#### Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

#### **EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION,**

Vet. Regs. Annex VII (except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

#### **SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES**

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV) Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3\*/4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016).

#### HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES/PONIES

- A. FL regulations require that all equines be covered by official interstate health certificates, issued by a licensed veterinarian, showing that the animals are free from any symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease. The certificate shall include the name of the owner and address, destination in FL, number of horses examined, the name, registration number(s), if any, tattoo, if any, sex, age, rectal temperature, color, and markings of each animal listed. Health certificates will become void after 30 days from issue. Heath certificates must show animals to be negative to an equine infectious anemia test within the past 12 months. Date of test and approved laboratory must be shown on health certificate. Equine Rhinopneuonitis vaccination is not required; however, if any animal is vaccinated, it is ineligible for entry within 21 days of vaccination. Vehicles transporting animals must have certificates showing that it was cleaned and disinfected under veterinary supervision prior to loading. This information can be written on the health certificate.



#### **Mandatory Requirements for Competition Organizers**

#### All ESP Comments / Applied Methods/ and Actions in Red Text

#### C. Definitions

**CDC** – Centers for Disease Control. All activity that occurs at a USEF-licensed competition must be conducted in accordance with CDC guidance protocols.

**Competition Area/Schooling Area** - For purposes of this document, any reference to competition area and/or schooling area includes rings, arenas, fields, cross-country fields, and any other areas designated for competition, schooling or exercise purposes.

**Competition Organizer** – For purposes of this document, Competition Organizer includes any individual or entity that acts as competition manager, licensee, and includes any designee(s) with management authority over the competition and its operations.

Competition Staff – For purposes of this document, competition staff includes any individual who is employed or contracted by competition management. Competition staff includes, but is not limited to, ring crews, jump crews, stable crews, competition office staff, medical personnel, awards crew, in-gate personnel, paddock managers, announcers, licensed officials, scribes, etc. • Officials - Any reference to officials, or licensed officials includes all types of competition officials (see GR113). For the purposes of this document, any individuals participating in an approved educational activity for a USEF or Recognized Affiliate licensing program (e.g. apprentices, training program participants, dressage applicants observing or sitting, clinicians, instructors, etc.) are also considered officials and must comply with all applicable requirements within the Action Plan.

Close Contact—For purposes of this document, close contact as defined by the CDC is someone who was within six (6) feet of an infected person for at least a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period\* beginning starting from two (2) days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, two (2) days prior to test specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated. It is important to note that close contact has occurred regardless of whether one, or both individuals is wearing a mask. (Refer to CDC FAQ).
\*Individual exposures added together over a 24-hour period (e.g., three 5-minute exposures for a total of 15 minutes).

Anyone who has been in contact with an individual who is confirmed or suspected to be COVID- 19-positive should quarantine in accordance with CDC Guidelines.

**COVID-19 Incident or Outbreak** – For purposes of this document, an incident is defined as a report of any COVID-19 related event or occurrence including, but not limited to, an individual who is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19. An outbreak is defined as multiple COVID-19 related incidents or occurrences.



Face Masks – For purposes of this document, any reference to face masks includes cloth face coverings, N-95, KN-95 and surgical masks. Competition Organizers must provide facemasks or face coverings to competition

staff, volunteers and officials. Face masks and face coverings must fully cover the nose and the mouth while being worn.

\*\*\*The CDC recommends wearing cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain. Cloth face coverings should fit snugly but comfortably against the side of the face, be secured with ties or ear loops, include multiple layers of fabric, allow for breathing without restriction and be able to be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape.

Isolation – Separation of a person or group of people known or reasonably believed to be infected with a communicable disease and potentially infectious, from those who are not infected to prevent the spread of the communicable disease.

Participants – For purposes of this document, any reference to Participants includes owners, lessees, riders, athletes, parents, vaulters, drivers, trainers, coaches, grooms, longeurs, navigators, personal care assistants (PCAs), and any other required support personnel/staff that are essential for providing care to the horses and/or the athletes.

**PPE** – Personal Protection Equipment.

Quarantine – Separation of a person or group of people, known or reasonably believed to have been exposed to a communicable disease but are not yet symptomatic, from others who have not yet been exposed, to prevent the possible spread of the communicable disease.

Social Distancing – Also called "physical distancing," means keeping a minimum of 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) space between yourself and other people outside your immediate household, as well as avoiding congregate settings or a concentration of individuals in a single area. (For consistent compliance ESP does not allow exceptions to social distancing requirements INCLUDING family members and/or people of your immediate household.)

• Immediate Household – Individuals consistently living in the same house or dwelling. Members of a household may or may not be related. For purposes of this document, immediate household may also be referred to as same household or own household (For consistent compliance ESP does not allow exceptions to social distancing requirements INCLUDING family members and/or people of your immediate household.)

Public/Spectators – For purposes of this document, spectators refers to the general public, fans, or any individuals who are not directly involved in the competition by way of being a participant, a member of competition staff, a service provider (e.g. media or photographer), volunteer, or other support personnel (farrier, veterinarian, etc.). There is to be a maximum of 5 people per horse: the rider, trainer, groom and \*two additional person\* If you are not one of five people allowed for a horse on the grounds, you will be considered to be spectating.

**Service Providers** – For purposes of this document, service providers are those individuals or entities who provide direct services contracted by competition management. Service providers include but are not limited



#### Definitions - continued

to vendors, caterers, feed suppliers, photographers, videographers, media, *venue/facility staff*, cleaning service providers (including portable restroom service), and waste disposal personnel.

**Support Personnel** - For purposes of this document, support personnel are those individuals employed or contracted by Participants who are essential for providing **to provide** care **or services** to horses and/or participants. Support personnel includes, but is not limited to, veterinarians, farriers, equine therapists, **grooms**, and braiders, etc.

**Symptoms** – Symptoms of COVID-19 include, but are not limited to, subjective or measured fever, cough, and shortness of breath and/or difficulty breathing. Additional symptoms may include sore throat, muscle pain, headache, chills/shaking, or newly developed loss of taste or smell.

**Temperature Monitoring** – The daily (or alternatively defined period) non-contact body temperature testing utilizing technology that scans forehead temperature (temporal or infrared thermometer) to measure an individual's body temperature to verify no fever is present. For purposes of this document, a fever is defined as an elevated body temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) 100.4° F (38° C) or higher. This definition of fever utilizes a temperature threshold slightly lower than in CDC guidelines, but this more stringent temperature threshold prevails as the requirement.

**WHO** – World Health Organization. All activity that occurs at a USEF-licensed competition must be conducted in accordance with WHO recommendations.

COVID-19 Action Plan for Competitions – Revised 11/28/20

#### D. General

USEF-Licensed competitions must operate in accordance with the USEF COVID-19 Action Plan for USEF-Licensed Competitions (Plan). This plan is based on federal, state and local regulations, **WHO** recommendations, CDC guidelines and USEF requirements. There will be times when regulations, recommendations, guidelines and requirements may differ. In these instances, the more restrictive regulations, recommendations, guidelines and requirements will prevail and supersede all others, e.g. face masks/coverings may not be required by a state or local government but is required at a USEF licensed competition nonetheless due to CDC guidance.

If an individual needs an accommodation under the American Disabilities Act, please submit the request, along with documentation of the disability and need for accommodation, to <a href="legalrequests@usef.org">legalrequests@usef.org</a>. It should be noted that we are experiencing a high volume of legal inquiries at this time, and we will respond as soon as possible. Requests for accommodations will be reviewed on a confidential basis with a medical consultant.

Additionally, competition organizers must implement the USEF requirements listed on the following pages, and are very strongly encouraged to implement all recommended best practices contained herein or similar practices for mitigating risks related to the COVID-19 virus.

These requirements are in effect immediately and until further notice, however, they are subject to revisions as the COVID-19 virus environment changes.



ESP has been instrumental in helping develop these protocols with USEF since the March shutdown. We have very diligently studied and applied actions for all requirements based on our operations and facilities. We have also enhanced and added additional protocols that we feel are best for the general welfare of our exhibitors. We have been in close contact with local authorities - and any competition held at our facility will be with their knowledge and support.

USEF Competition Organizers must complete the WHO Mass Gathering for Sports Risk Assessment Tool and work with state and local governments and public health authorities prior to the start of the competition to help determine risks and mitigation measures. Competition Organizers are encouraged to consult their insurers and legal counsel as well. ESP completed the WHO Mass Gathering for Sport Risk Assessment Tool in April. We are considered low risk with an impressive mitigation score of 86%

#### E. Agreements

**For currently licensed competitions:** Execute the Addendum to the USEF Licensing Agreement (provided by USEF) by the required deadline prior to the start of the competition.

- Ensure that all participants, including licensed officials and volunteers, provide emergency contact information and execute an updated *Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement* required by USEF, as a condition of participation. Please ensure use of the updated form for competitions starting on May 6, 2020, or after. This form will be made available with the entry blanks. Please note that all riders, parents and/or guardians, owners, coaches, and trainers must sign this form before any back numbers are assigned. Absolutely no entries will be accepted or processed before a back number is assigned with this process. No exceptions!
- *Prior to the start of a competition, c*reate an Emergency Response Plan specific to a COVID-19 incident or outbreak that includes local medical resources and addresses outbreak protocols including medical evaluation, isolation and quarantine, and reporting. ESP has modified its emergency response plan for all accidents to include COVID-19 protocols. If there are any instances of an outbreak, our local contracted PBCFR authorities will handle this situation in the quarantine tent located by the onsite Fire Rescue unit.
- If a COVID-19 incident or outbreak occurs, USEF, all *competition staff, service providers, participants, and support personnel* participants and competition staff must be notified. Emails will be required from all participants and competition staff and notification will be distributed upon such an occurrence.
- Provide training for competition staff, volunteers and licensed officials regarding all procedures and requirements associated with the Plan. All staff have been distributed copies of the ESP Accident plan.

- Ensure vendors and service providers are included in the communication and training requirements associated with the Plan. Vendors will be limited but any that are allowed to be on the grounds will be included in those notified.
- Disseminate a copy of the Plan to all applicable competition personnel- Covered above.
- A minimum of 14 days prior to the start of the competition, inform (e.g., via prize list/omnibus, website, social media, email, etc.) all participants, officials and competition personnel of protocols and safeguards implemented for their protection against spreading COVID-19 by providing them with a list of such measures. With constant changes needed to be made to the USEF COVID-19 Action Plan for USEF Licensed Competitions, this document will be updated as needed on the PBIEC.coth.com. under the competitors tab.

#### F. Access

- General access to the PBIEC show grounds is limited to a maximum of 5 people per horse: the rider, trainer, groom and \*two additional persons\*.
- Require and provide for onsite temperature monitoring for volunteers, officials, competition staff and service providers once daily prior to entering the competition grounds. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4° F (38° C) or higher may not enter the facility. As implemented in May, we will continue to check everyone's temperature before they are allowed access to the grounds. Everyone will either be checked by the thermal camera system or at entry point gates A-N with a touchless thermometer before they are allowed access through the gate. Anyone with a temperature below 100.4° F (38° C) may enter the facility. We ask that everyone check their own temperature at home before coming to work to avoid any incident of possible exposure before this mandatory check at the entry gate.
- The following individuals are not allowed to enter the competition grounds: Anyone who:
- o Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms,
- o Anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within last two weeks-10 days,
- o Anyone who has tested positive outside of the past 10 days, but is still symptomatic,

or

\* Anyone who has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for

COVID-19 within the last two weeks 14 days. cannot enter the competition grounds. This is posted at the entry gate.

- \*Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical- grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempted from this restriction.
- Refer to Appendix A for Self-Isolation/Self-Quarantine Directives in the event a person has a fever or exhibits other symptoms of COVID-19.
- \*\*Please reference Participant requirements regarding temperature monitoring on page 10 for Participant responsibilities.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup>If a situation arises regarding access that is not addressed in this Action Plan, please contact USEF. Direct inquiries to ksacco@usef.org or dsaliling@usef.org.

- Inform all competition staff, service providers, participants, and support personnel that if any
  individual who was present on the competition grounds tests positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of
  the conclusion of competition, that individual must immediately notify the Competition Organizer, the
  USEF, and local public health authorities. Direct USEF reports to ksacco@usef.org.
- Competition Organizers must notify USEF and local public health authorities, as well as all competition staff, service providers, participants, and support personnel if any individual who was present on the competition grounds tests positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of the conclusion of the competition. Direct USEF reports to ksacco@usef.org. ESP will notify all required parties once ESP management have been made aware of a positive.
- Competition Organizers will direct the reporting individual to contact the local public health authorities (and provide the contact information) for the purposes of having the local public health authorities perform contact tracing.
- Competition Organizers are to remind all competition staff, service providers, participants, and support personnel of their responsibility to report if they test positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of the conclusion of competition (refer to Section L).
- Require a face mask or face covering for all staff, officials, volunteers, service providers and
  participants at all times while on competition grounds when not mounted on a horse, seated *riding* in
  a horse-drawn carriage or cart, or during in-hand classes as outlined by the procedures\* below.
   Competition Organizers must provide face masks or face coverings to competition staff, volunteers
  and officials. You can find recommendations for proper use of face masks and face coverings via the
  Centers for Disease Control & Prevention website.
- To eat or drink, an individual must move far enough away from others to minimize the possibility of being within six feet of any other individual before the lowering the mask or face covering to eat or drink.
   The mask must be immediately replaced over the nose and mouth when finished.
- o If an individual requires modification to this face mask/face covering requirement, please submit written request, accompanied by documentation substantiating the need for modification, to legalrequests@usef.org sgilbert@usef.org. It should be noted that we are experiencing a high volume of legal inquiries at this time, and we will respond as quickly as possible. Requests for modifications will be reviewed on a confidential basis with a medical consultant.
- \*In-Hand Class Procedures face masks or face coverings that fully cover your nose and mouth are required at all times at USEF-licensed competitions, including while exhibiting horses and ponies in-hand. However, if absolutely necessary, you may lower your mask while jogging or running with a horse or pony in-hand, or while executing a pattern, but only if you are able to maintain social distancing of at least six feet while doing so. The mask must be replaced immediately once the jog, or run, or pattern, is completed.
- \*\*A participant cannot be disqualified or penalized for wearing a facemask or face covering while competing. As enforced by ESP since May, these requirements will continue to be enforced by all ESP personnel. We take these basic requirements very seriously to help prevent the spread so please be prepared to wear masks and maintain social distancing at all times while on the grounds or please don't show with us.
- \*\*A participant cannot be disqualified or penalized for wearing a facemask or face covering while competing. All judges will be notified. No penalties will also apply to goiter style masks that are draped around the neck. All ESP judges have been notified in writing prior to arrival at the show.

#### G. Signage

- Post signage that displays all applicable federal, state and local regulations, requirements and orders as well as WHO recommendations and CDC guidelines as they relate to mass gatherings and sporting events in effect at the competition. Posted at all entrances as well as appropriate signage throughout the property.
- Post signage throughout the competition grounds that lists the requirements for social distancing and the use of face masks/face coverings. Posted at all entrances as well as appropriate signage throughout the property.
  - USEF provided posters: Face Masks & Social Distancing
  - Post signage at all entrances to the competition grounds which identifies the symptoms of COVID-19 and states the following:
  - 1. To protect others from possible transmission of the virus, anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms or has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks (exception, healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties), cannot enter the competition grounds. These individuals are encouraged to contact their health care provider immediately for further medical advice and must obtain documented clearance from their health care provider before entering the competition grounds. Participants must assume responsibility for themselves and their own staff (e.g. grooms, assistants, etc.). Posted at all entrances

Sample poster: Symptoms of Coronavirus Disease Posted in multiple locations throughout the property

- Post signage throughout the competition grounds (i.e. competition office, competition and schooling areas, barns, etc.) which includes recommendations about good hygiene along with informing participants and others about ways to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission. Posted in multiple locations throughout the property
- Sample Poster: CDC Stop the Spread of Germs Posted in multiple locations throughout the property

#### H. Social Distancing & Limiting Entries and/or Stabling

Enforce social distancing requirements throughout the competition grounds at all times. All ESP Staff will be wearing florescent vests displaying the constant reminder of social distancing. All ESP staff members will have the authority to warn and remind anyone on ESP facility property of the necessity of social distancing. We also realize that many of you have quarantined together. We ask that EVERYONE abide by social distancing protocols while outside of your cars on the grounds. This includes members of their immediate household. With the exception of parents with toddlers, we are asking everyone on the grounds to remain six feet apart so that the social distancing requirements remain uniform and builds on healthy distancing habits. This is very important for the effective enforcement and safety of everyone on the grounds.

All individuals must practice social distancing (or physical distancing) at all times while on the competition grounds by staying at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from any person. Everyone is required to wear masks or face coverings at all times while on competition grounds. when there is a possibility of being within six feet of any other individuals, including members of their own household. Everyone should have a mask on at all times. Everyone should observe social distancing.

#### \*Exceptions

- Social distancing is not required when competing in driving classes where more than one participant is seated **riding** in the horse-drawn carriage or cart.
- o Individuals are allowed to be seated together while being transported by golf cart (or similar four-wheeled transport vehicle), but capacity may not exceed the number of seats on the cart or vehicle and all individuals must wear face masks or face coverings.
  - Congregating on or around a parked or stationary golf cart or vehicle is prohibited, unless the individuals are all visually identifiable (e.g. credentialed) as immediate household members, are all wearing face masks/face coverings, and do not exceed the seating capacity of the cart or vehicle.
  - ESP will not allow congregating by anyone.
- Competition Organizers are encouraged to implement a system that visually (e.g., numbered or colored IDs or some other form of credential) identifies members of the same household. Effective August 24, 2020, ESP has elected to stop issuing arm bands to family members. With the exception of parents with toddlers, we are asking everyone on the grounds to remain six feet apart so that the social distancing requirements remain uniform and builds on healthy distancing habits. This is very important for the effective enforcement and safety of everyone on the grounds. Please remember there is to be a maximum of 5 people per horse: the rider, trainer, groom and \*two additional persons\*.
  - Prohibit the public, spectators, and non-essential personnel such as guests from being on the competition grounds until further notice. Posted and regulated by all ESP Staff
  - o Competition Organizers must determine whether a sponsor can be present on competition grounds by assessing whether the sponsor meets the criteria of being essential to providing care to the horses or athletes, or provides direct services contracted by the Competition Organizer. If sponsors are present, they must comply with face mask/face covering, social distancing, and all other requirements. <mark>ESP</mark> Sponsorship personnel have been in communication with sponsors. Sponsors (while observing all COVID-19 protocols) will be allowed on the property (if they so choose) for the purposes of presentations.
  - Organize horse arrivals and departures to limit contact between people. Stall assignments will be issued by aisle. In any instance where an aisle must be shared, security will regulate unloading so groups can stay apart during this process. All trailer in parking (while allowed) will be directed by security to give sufficient area for social distancing requirements.

Arrange judges' and other officials' areas to comply with social distancing requirements. In the event that it is absolutely impossible to maintain social distancing of six (6) feet or more, the erection of a solid, rigid non-porous, securely attached divider must be placed in the location where social distancing cannot be maintained (i.e., between, in front of and/or behind seating areas). The divider provides a physical separation and barrier between individuals and therefore must be of sufficient size to effectively and significantly reduce the risk of respiratory particulates being spread. located in front of, and between individuals, and of sufficient size to reduce the risk of respiratory particulates being spread, must be used. The inclusion of such dividers does not eliminate the requirement to wear face masks or face coverings. For additional specifics regarding dividers, please reference the Competition Organizer COVID- 19 Action Plan FAQs.

All judging areas on the ESP Competition grounds have been modified to meet or exceed these requirements.

- Restrict competition office access to essential personnel only, configure the space and limit the number of office staff to comply with social distancing, and limit the number of participants who can enter the competition office at one time (e.g., schedule check- in/check-out times) Signs have been placed on the outside of the office for rules and guidelines. There is now a separate entrance and exit. We have added five new walk up windows so that it is optional to enter the office. As always, ESP exhibitors can manage all of their entries online through our ShowGroundsLive.com. All staff radios, computers, clip boards, judges cards, etc., will be delivered to their location before the show and picked up after completion. Exhibitors may also arrange for office appointments in advance by emailing Jennifer Glosson @ iglosson@equestriansport.com or Hali Miller @ CASEY255@GMAIL.COM .
- Competition Organizers must notify USEF if entries are to be limited. There are posted total numbers of rounds allowed per ring on the competition schedule. This may be changed as proficiency for scheduled times improves or declines. Management reserves the right to cancel warmups or move divisions to other rings to best accommodate those on the waiting list. At all times, no entries will be processed before: back numbers are assigned (10,000 or 20,000 numbers assigned by online is not a back number), a method of payment on file and all proper waivers are completed. After back numbers are assigned the entry process will open on a first come first serve basis.
- The FEI will determine whether entries may be limited in FEI classes. Any possible FEI restrictions (if implemented) will be noted in the draft schedules and approved by the FEI.
- Competition Organizers may limit entries to the competition and/or to specific sections/classes within the competition to manage the concentration of horses and people. There will be total numbers or rounds allowed per ring as explained above.
  - Regardless of the scope of the limitation, the limiting of entries must be done on a first come, first served basis and relevant information must be posted on the competition website or in the prize list, as well as at the competition office and at each competition area (i.e. ring, arena, field, cross country course). First come first serve will be automated as described above through the SGL software.
  - Competition management must also communicate the system used for notifying and "wait-listing" individuals who submit entries after the available spaces are filled, and the method must be equally applied to all potential participants. First come first serve will be automated as described above through the SGL software. Those placed on the "add waiting list" will be informed by the show secretaries if management determines that the adds can be accepted.
  - Configure stabling to comply with social distancing requirements in order to manage concentration of horses and people. Described below:
  - Competition Organizers must notify USEF if stabling is to be limited. Stabling will be limited as described below.
  - Regardless of the scope of the limitation, the limiting of stabling MUST be done on a first come, first served basis and relevant information must be posted on the competition website or in the prize list. Stabling will only be offered to those who correctly fill out entries as described in the entry process. Once exhibitors are assigned numbers, the availability of stalls will be opened. Our tent aisles have been modified to a minimum 10 feet wide in order to allow for people to pass each other on opposite sides with social distancing room to spare. Please remember that all barn areas should be restricted to grooms, trainers, vets and other essential personnel. Signage in English and Spanish are placed in the barn areas.

- Competition Organizer must also communicate the system used for notifying and "wait-listing" individuals who submit stabling requests after the available spaces are filled, and the method must be equally applied to all potential participants. Stabling will be assigned on a first come first serve basis. Anyone on a waiting list will be notified where they are on that list.
- Competition Organizers must publish their policy regarding entry and stall refunds within the prize list and/or on the competition website.

#### I. Enforcement Authority

USEF Stewards and Technical Delegates will inform individuals when they are not in compliance with the regulations and requirements in effect at the competition and shall report such situations to the Competition Organizer. The Competition Organizer has the authority under GR 702.1 and GR914 to remove from the facility any person who does not comply with the regulations and requirements in effect at the competition. Stewards/Technical Delegates must report the removal of any person from competition grounds for noncompliance with regulations and requirements in effect at the competition in their USEF Steward/Technical Delegate Report. ESP had a very successful opening in May and June with the majority of exhibitors being very cooperative with all COVID-19 protocols. We are confident that all participants will continue to comply with these requirements that have been established to keep everyone safe. ESP does reserve the right to remove anyone from the show grounds that does not comply with any of the posted COVID-19 protocols.

Competition Organizers are responsible for enforcing all social distancing and face mask/face covering requirements. ESP Management will continue to enforce all of these requirements.

- Stewards/TDs are required to report compliance on the part of Competition Organizers with respect to the mandatory requirements listed above. Any such occurrence will be reported.
  - Did the Competition Organizer confirm completion of the WHO Mass Gathering for Sports Risk Assessment Tool? Yes we did. We are considered low risk with an impressive mitigation score of 86%
  - Did Competition Organizer adhere to the requirements listed above in Sections D-H to the best of its abilities, including posting the required signage?

#### **Mandatory Requirements for Participants**

#### J. General

USEF-Licensed competitions must operate in accordance with the USEF COVID-19 Action Plan for USEF-Licensed Competitions (Plan). This plan is based on federal, state and local regulations, WHO recommendations, CDC guidelines and USEF requirements. There will be times when regulations, recommendations, guidelines and requirements may differ. In these instances, the more restrictive regulations, recommendations, guidelines and requirements will prevail and supersede all others, e.g. face masks/coverings may not be required by a state or local government but is required at a USEF licensed competition nonetheless due to CDC guidance.

If an individual needs an accommodation under the American Disabilities Act, please submit the request, along with documentation of the disability and need for accommodation, to legalrequests@usef.org. It should be noted that we are experiencing a high volume of legal inquiries at this time, and we will respond as soon as possible. Requests for accommodations will be reviewed on a confidential basis with a medical consultant.

Participants are required to comply with these and any additional Competition Organizer requirements at all times while present on competition grounds. Failure to do so may result in expulsion from the grounds.

These requirements are in effect immediately and until further notice, however, they are subject to revisions as the COVID-19 virus environment changes.

#### K. Waiver/Release & Indemnity Agreement

Provide emergency contact information and execute an updated Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement required by USEF, as a condition of participation. Please ensure use of the updated form provided by competition organizer. ESP is also asking for accurate cell phone numbers and email address to use in the case of notification requirements.

#### L. Access

- Participants and Support Personnel are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the competition grounds. Anyone with a temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) 100.4° F (38° C) or higher may not enter the facility. As implemented in May, we will continue to check everyone's temperature before they are allowed access to the grounds. Everyone will either be checked by the thermal camera system or at entry point gates A-N with a touchless thermometer before they are allowed access through the gate.
- The following individuals are not allowed to enter the competition grounds: Anyone who:
- o Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms,
- o Anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within last two weeks 10 days,
- Anyone who has tested positive outside of the past 10 days, but is still symptomatic,

o \* Anyone who has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for

COVID-19 within the last two weeks 14 days. cannot enter the competition grounds.

- \*Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical- grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempted from this restriction.
- Refer to Appendix A for CDC guidelines for self-isolation/quarantine directives in the event a person has a fever or exhibits other symptoms of COVID-19. Attached

Participants and Support Personnel are required to wear a facemask or face covering at all times while on competition grounds when not mounted on a horse, seated *riding* in a horse-drawn carriage or cart, or during in-hand classes as outlined by the \*procedures below. You can find recommendations for proper use of face masks and face coverings via the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention website.

To eat or drink, an individual must move far enough away from others to minimize the possibility of being within six feet of any other individual before the lowering the mask or face covering to eat or drink. The mask must be immediately replaced over the nose and mouth when finished.

o If an individual requires modification to this face mask/face covering requirement, please submit written request, accompanied by documentation substantiating the need for modification, to legalrequests@usef.org sgilbert@usef.org. It should be noted that we are experiencing a high volume of legal inquiries at this time, and we will respond as quickly as possible. Requests for modifications will be reviewed on a confidential basis with a medical consultant.

As required since May, these requirements will continue to be enforced by all ESP personnel. All ESP Staff will be wearing florescent vests displaying the constant reminder of social distancing and all personnel will enforce face mask requirements as well. We take these basic requirements very seriously to help prevent the spread so please be prepared to wear masks and maintain social distancing at all times while on the grounds or please don't show with us.

\*In-Hand Class Procedures - face masks or face coverings that fully cover your nose and mouth are required at all times at USEF-licensed competitions, including while exhibiting horses and ponies inhand. However, if absolutely necessary, you may lower your mask while jogging or running with a horse or pony in-hand, or while executing a pattern, but only if you are able to maintain social distancing of at least six feet while doing so. The mask must be replaced immediately once the jog, or run, or pattern, is completed.

\*\*A participant may choose to wear a facemask or face covering when mounted on a horse and cannot be disqualified or penalized for doing so while competing. Please remember that showing in Florida heat can be very taxing on your body. Please make sure that you take this under consideration when making this decision. Please stay extra hydrated and wear devices (if you so choose) that do not contribute to Heat related illnesses such as Heat Exhaustion or Heat Stroke.

- If any person who was present on the competition grounds tests positive for COVID-19 within 14 days
  of the conclusion of competition, USEF, and the Competition Organizer, and local public health
  authorities must be notified immediately. Direct USEF reports to ksacco@usef.org. Competition
  Organizers will provide the reporting individual with contact information for the local public health
  authorities who will perform the contact tracing process.
- \*\*\*Questions regarding access to competition grounds and eligibility to participate in competition that may not be clearly identified under the points above or under
- Point F on page 9 must be directed to ksacco@usef.org or dsaliling@usef.org, who will consult with USEF medical experts and provide a written decision from the USEF with regard to the participant's eligibility.
- M. Social Distancing/Participation Protocols
- All individuals must practice social distancing (or physical distancing) at all times while on the competition grounds by staying at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from any person who is not a member of their *immediate household*. Members of the same household are still required to wear masks or face coverings at all times while on competition grounds.
- \* Exceptions

 Social distancing is not required while competing (including warm-up) in driving classes where more than one participant is seated riding in the horse-drawn carriage or cart. Individuals are allowed to be seated together while being transported by golf cart (or similar four-wheeled transport vehicle), but capacity may not exceed the number of seats on the cart or vehicle and all individuals must wear face masks or face coverings.

Congregating on or around a parked or stationary golf cart or vehicle is prohibited, unless the
individuals are all visually identifiable (e.g. credentialed) as immediate household members, are all
wearing face masks/face coverings, and do not exceed the seating capacity of the cart or vehicle.

As of August 24, 2020 ESP has elected to stop issuing arm bands to family members. With the exception of parents with toddlers, we are asking everyone on the grounds to remain six feet apart so that the social distancing requirements remain uniform and builds on healthy distancing habits. This is very important for the effective enforcement and safety of everyone on the grounds.-Everyone should have a mask on at all times. All ESP Staff will be wearing florescent vests displaying the constant reminder of social distancing. All ESP staff members will have the authority to warn and remind anyone on ESP facility property of the necessity of social distancing. We also realize that many of you have quarantined together for months. We ask that EVERYONE abide by social distancing protocols while outside of your cars on the grounds. Please remember there is to be a maximum of 5 people per horse: the rider, trainer, groom and \*two additional persons\*.

• Wash hands often and adhere to other sanitization practices throughout the day. We have secured as much hand sanitizer as possible. We have ample sanitizer dispensers placed around all entrances, ingates, bathrooms, show office as well as key areas around the grounds. If you find any dispensers on the grounds out of supply, please bring this to managements attention and it will be rectified immediately. We have also placed portable sinks at the rings supplied with high quality antibacterial soap.

#### **Recommended Best Practices for Competition Organizers**

The following Recommended Best Practices have been provided to assist Competition Organizers with determining risks and developing measures to mitigate those risks. Please note these are not mandatory, however USEF strongly encourages their implementation.

#### N. General Considerations

- To the extent possible, limit the number of entrances and exits to the venue to manage crowding, social distancing and venue limitations. We have installed security fencing at the facility to prevent anyone from getting in without going through any of the seventeen security gate check points. This was done to regulate all people accessing the property in addition to checking everyone's temperature.
- It is strongly recommended that competition organizers secure additional staff or volunteers dedicated
  to monitoring adherence to Action Plan requirements, and who can support USEF Stewards', Technical
  Delegates' and Competition Management's efforts to ensure compliance with safety protocols. ESP has
  hired additional stewards, "COVID Cops" and personnel since May to help enforce all rules including
  but not limited to ESP COVID-19 Action Plan Rules
  - Communication Use radio, phone and online communication methods as much as possible and communicate important information frequently throughout the competition grounds. Announcers and ingate personnel make constant announcements reminding everyone of social distancing and mask requirements. We have also implemented a mass text communication platform to inform everyone of changes in the schedules, ring delays or emergencies such as thunderstorms.
- It is strongly recommended that competition organizers conduct exhibitor meetings (virtually, telephonically, or in an environment where social distancing can be maintained) both prior to and during the competition to communicate requirements and address questions.

- VIP and other social areas are strongly discouraged unless social distancing requirements are enforced in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local regulations, requirements and orders as well as WHO recommendations and CDC guidelines as they relate to mass gatherings and sporting events. There will be no VIP or social areas at the ESP venue through December.
- It is strongly recommended that if people are going to travel together in the same vehicle to a competition, they should take their temperature prior to getting into the vehicle to ensure no one travels to the competition with an elevated temperature. This should include golf cart transportation.

### O. Considerations for Facilities, Staff, Medical Personnel, Service Providers & Volunteers

- Cleaning/Sanitizing Locations
  - Service providers and support personnel are recommended to comply with the following:
  - Register with the competition organizer and indicate when they are going to be on the competition grounds;
  - Sign a waiver provided by the organizer;
  - o Comply with any competition organizer requirements to change PPE (face mask/face coverings, etc.) when moving between stables; and
  - o Comply with all social distancing and face mask/face covering requirements, and sanitizing best practices while on competition grounds; and
  - Do not linger or socialize in stables or anywhere else on competition grounds while performing or after completing work.
  - Provide hand sanitization stations with access to soap and water or alcohol based hand sanitizer at each competition area and schooling/warm up area. We have secured as much hand sanitizer as possible. We have ample sanitizer dispensers placed around all entrances, ingates, bathrooms, show office as well as key areas around the grounds. If you find any dispensers on the grounds out of supply, please bring this to management's attention and it will be rectified immediately. We have also placed portable sinks at all rings supplied with high quality antibacterial soap.
  - Provide hand sanitizer to all officials, ring crew, office staff and maintenance staff. ESP have provided this to staff since March and will continue to do so.
    - Frequently sanitize surfaces touched by many: door handles, arena gates, wash racks and hoses, etc. Cleaning staff covering the bathrooms will make regular trips to the office to sanitize door handles. Hand sanitizer will be placed outside the office entry and exit door. New New Water coolers have been installed at the ingates with disposable cups and "handless" levers that are pushed by cups or containers. We are encouraging all exhibitors and staff to purchase their own refillable containers to cut down on waste. Antibacterial soap dispensers have also been placed at the common wash rack area. Please encourage your grooms to wash their hands after using the common hoses.
  - Ensure frequent cleaning and sanitizing of bathrooms, provide soap and water or alcohol based hand sanitizer in bathrooms. Each bathroom area on the show grounds will be assigned a staff cleaner to constantly wipe down all touched areas. Reminders will be placed outside and inside bathrooms to use the quality antibacterial soap that will be kept in plentiful supply.

For the continued safety of all our cleaning staff, we would respectfully remind anyone using the bathroom areas around our cleaning crew to give them the same social distancing area as anyone else on the grounds. Thank you in advance for your consideration.

Prohibit the use of public water fountains. The public water fountains will be disabled until further notice. New Water coolers have been installed at the ingates with disposable cups and "handless" levers that are pushed by cups or containers. We are encouraging all exhibitors and staff to purchase their own refillable containers to cut down on waste.



- Strongly encourage all competitors to complete entry forms, in their entirety, including having all requisite memberships in place, prior to entering competition office. In May we introduced electronic entries to be made and signed remotely. Signs have been placed on the outside of the office for rules and guidelines. There is now a separate entrance and exit with direction arrows on the ground and social distancing place markers. We have added five new walk up windows so that it is optional to enter the office. As always, ESP exhibitors can manage all of their entries online through our ShowGroundsLive.com.
  - Strongly encourage that all entries, adds, scratches, feed & bedding orders, billing/invoicing are done electronically. Our SGL software has always allowed for adds, scratches, viewing bills and making payments remotely. With these features there is little reason that would require someone to visit the office. All feed and bedding are handled through Gold Coast Feed. Phone in orders are the primary means of ordering.
  - •Install clear plastic, glass or other type of protective shield/barrier in front of office staff. This has been built and installed.
  - Provide hand sanitizer near the door. This is provided at entry door and inside exit door.
  - Provide an 'in' door and an 'out' door, if possible. These have been provided with proper signage in English and Spanish and directional arrows placed on the floor.
  - Provide markers to delineate 6 feet spacing between people in the office and in any waiting lines (e.g., markers on floor). Measured areas marked and provided.
  - Prepare and email competitor bills as early as possible. SGL online close out capability provided. You may also request bills to be printed in advance by emailing Jennifer Glosson @ iglosson@equestriansport.com or Hali Miller @ CASEY255@GMAIL.COM
  - Establish appointment times for checkout at the competition office. SGL online capability provided. You may also request an office appointment in advance by emailing Jennifer Glosson @ iglosson@equestriansport.com or Hali Miller @ CASEY255@GMAIL.COM
- Service Providers and Vendors
- Advise any service providers (e.g. vendors, food-service, farrier, feed suppliers, waste disposal personnel) to take precautions in accordance with federal, state, local and facility regulations and CDC guidelines. All advised
- For onsite food-service, consider requesting provision of pre-packaged food only.

#### P. Competition, Schooling and Exercise Area Considerations

- Utilize posted orders of go and/or published ride times including online orders of go and ride times. During the show, this will continued to be provided online through our SGL software. For schooling days the jumps in the show rings cannot be touched or altered by exhibitors. We have designated time slots by height for back number schooling. In addition, we have made it possible to remotely "enter" through SGL a specific 15-20 time slot by height so you know exactly when you can arrive to school. Please see the time schedule for these options. Walk ups will be accommodated by ingate personnel on a first come first serve basis.
  - At venues with multiple competition areas, consider designating one area as primary where assigned times and/or orders of go take precedence. The priority ring will be established based on daily numbers and time constraints. This will be announced or provided by mass text notification.
- Consider scheduling course walks as necessary to comply with social distancing requirements (e.g., schedule small groups in separate sections). All courses will be posted on our website for all disciplines. ALL, course walks will be extremely brief, with social distancing protocols strictly enforced and should be focused only in areas where distances are not provided. Management reserves the right to close any ring at any time to walking if protocols are not being followed.
  - Utilize individual water bottles versus community water coolers. New Water coolers have been installed at the ingates with disposable cups and "handless" levers that are pushed by cups or containers. We are encouraging all exhibitors and staff to purchase their own refillable containers to cut down on waste.
- Limit and organize seating areas to comply with social distancing requirements. There will be extremely limited seating and placed far apart. All bleachers have been removed. We are strongly encouraging people to stay in their cars until getting on their horse. Please note that Golf Cart occupants should not sit in golf carts violating social distancing requirements. Once the golf cart has reached its destination, all occupants should get out. Please remember, if you are looking for a chair you should probably go to your car. Spectating is not allowed at this time.
- Restrict the number of people accompanying a horse to the competition area to those persons who are needed for safety or for achieving effective competition, but they all must comply with social distancing requirements. There will be numerous signs and warnings to limit each showing horse with a maximum of 5 people. Rider, Trainer, Groom and two other companions. These and all social distancing requirements will be enforced by any and all ESP personnel. All ESP personnel will wear neon safety vest displaying social distancing enforcement. This will remain a constant reminder to anyone on the grounds to remain vigilant in maintain social distancing at all times.
- Schooling and exercise area provisions:
- Provide monitors to ensure compliance with requirements and best practices. Always monitored and controlled by stewards, schooling supervisors and/or ingate personnel. A maximum of one person per schooling standard will be allowed per schooling jump. Each schooling jump will be spaced at least 8' apart to accommodate people on both sides with social distancing.
- Schooling jumps Provide sanitizing items (spray bottles, wipes) at each competition arena and schooling/warm-up area and advise individuals to wear gloves while handling the jumps and to wipe down jump equipment after use. We will be advising exhibitors to continue to use gloves when using schooling jumps in the common areas. We will provide rubber gloves upon request, but please plan on using your own gloves of choice. Common jump cups and schooling rails have been "fogged" with a product called "Gold Shield." This is a product that is used in hospitals to coat surfaces that prevent areas for viruses to attach to. The product states that the coating lasts for

your private business. Random spot checks will be preformed by ESP management or stewards to remind and enforce any observed violations to COVID-19 protocols.

• Provide hand sanitization stations in the stabling area and encourage stable personnel to use frequently. ESP will not be providing hand sanitizer in the barn areas. The barns are in close proximity to sanitizer locations and bathrooms with antibacterial soap. ESP will be providing hand sanitizer and supplies in all of the common areas. The barn area assigned to your operation is your responsibility to operate and apply all best management practices.

#### **Recommended Best Practices for Participants**

Although not mandatory, Participants are strongly encouraged to follow the Recommended Best Practices listed below at all times while present on the competition grounds.

#### R. Access & Monitoring Considerations

- Provide non-contact thermometers (e.g., temporal or infrared) to staff and require temperature monitoring throughout the day. It is extremely important that all Trainers, Owners, Riders and Support personnel establish a regular practice of taking your temperature before leaving your house. Not all people that have been infected with the virus have a fever, but for ANYONE who does have a fever should not come on the show grounds under any circumstances.
- Limit access to stabling area and competition grounds to essential personnel only; discourage multiple family members from accompanying owners and riders. All barn areas will be restricted to grooms, trainers and other essential personnel. Signage in English and Spanish are placed in the barn areas. Trainers - The barn area assigned to your operation is your responsibility to operate and apply all best management practices. It is your responsibility to restrict your barn area to grooms and essential staff only. DO NOT ALLOW YOUR CLIENTS TO LOITER IN THE BARN AREAS.
- Consider having riders meet their horses at the competition or schooling areas or other pre-designated area to further limit contact in the stabling area. Trainers and your staff should give the most accurate times for when your client will show. ESP ingate personnel will be updating the SGL system to the best of their ability, however, keep in mind there are unforeseen situations that can cause delays. (Injuries, thrown shoes, thunderstorms, etc.) We ask that you have your clients remain in their cars until it is their turn to mount, warm up and be ready to compete in the ring on time. Please keep in mind that we will be enforcing time limits on when you are expected in the ring. Be considerate to your fellow competitors showing after you that are monitoring their posted times.
- Consider the use of mounting blocks to avoid one-on-one contact between riders and grooms/assistants. Mounting blocks are available at every schooling area.
- Provide adequate food and beverage supplies for your barn and your support staff for the duration of the competition to avoid unnecessary community exposure. Trainers - You are responsible for your staff. Please make sure you are using knowledgeable professionals that understand all COVID-19 protocols and risks. Please make sure they are taking all necessary precautions both at work and outside of work. Please do not supplement extra personnel into the horse show operation other than the staff you have employed and trusted at your personal operation. The barn area assigned to your operation is your responsibility to operate and apply all best management practices. Trainers are asked to please bring all the same materials and operating protocols that you have implemented in your private barn operation since the COVID-19 pandemic started. ESP will not be providing materials in the barn areas that are essential to operate your private business.

It is strongly recommended that if people are going to travel together in the same vehicle to a competition, they should take their temperature prior to getting into the vehicle to ensure no one travels to the competition with an elevated temperature. This should include golf cart transportation.



Riders- please rely on your trainers and their staff to give the best times for when you will show. ESP ingate personnel will be updating the SGL system to the best of their ability, however, keep in mind there are unforeseen situations that can cause delays. (Injuries, thrown shoes, thunderstorms, etc.) We ask that you remain in your cars until it is your turn to mount, warm up and be ready to compete in the ring on time. Please keep in mind that we will be enforcing time limits on when you are expected in the ring. Be considerate to your fellow competitors showing after you that are monitoring their posted times.

Riders, parents and owners should not be in the barn areas. If you are responsible for your own horse then you will be placed as an individual barn and separated accordingly.

Always comply with all best practices and guidelines in effect at the competition. All of the COVID-19 protocols that have been established and will be enforced are for EVERYONES wellbeing. We ask that all of you take them seriously and remain vigilant.

One important note about Thunderstorms. PLEASE plan on going to your cars in the event of any delay. We cannot afford a situation where groups of people try to go to a single area violating the social distancing protocols. Your personal car should be your safe place at all times.

Social media posting- Please consider when posting anything on social media that is negative can be a reflection on our entire sport. ESP have done our best to address every area of our sport to make it as safe as possible to continue safely during this worldwide pandemic. Although the phrase "We are in this together" has become overused, we must depend on everyone in our sport to come together to do our individual part. ESP is committed to enforcing all restrictions to the best of our ability, but we cannot control everyone or everything that takes place on the grounds. Negative social media can cause unnecessary hardship to our entire industry that have already suffered severe economic effects. Please take an extra look at a photo to examine if something looks out of context. Please consider posting a date when posting a photo at a horse show prior to COVID-19 protocols that may be considered a violation of social distancing by today's standards. More importantly, if you witness anything that you feel is unsafe in this current environment, Any COVID-19 protocols that are not being followed, PLEASE BRING IT TO MANAGEMENTS ATTENTION FIRST so that we can correct to problem as quickly as possible. We are all learning how to make things safer and it is ESP's continued pledge to make whatever changes we can to ensure everyone's safety and wellbeing.

#### S. Cleaning & Sanitizing Considerations

• Provide hand sanitizer, gloves, masks, and other PPE deemed necessary to your barn staff and other personnel and encourage them to use these items on a regular basis. ESP will continue to provide gloves at the in-gates upon request until further notice.

- Do not mix equipment (tack, grooming supplies, lead shanks, etc.) and sanitize between each use.
- Regularly sanitize bikes/motorbikes/golf carts/car & truck door handles, stable doors, bucket handles, light switches, etc., and equipment including tack, grooming, feeding, stall cleaning materials, etc.

Again, the barn area assigned to your operation is your responsibility to operate and apply all best management practices. Trainers are asked to please bring all the same materials and operating protocols that you have implemented in your private barn operation since the COVID-19 pandemic started. ESP will not be providing materials in the barn areas that are essential to operate your private business.



#### T. Scheduling Considerations

• Schedule competition days (ride times, schooling times, etc.) as efficiently as possible to minimize time spent on the competition grounds each day. ESP continues to provide access to online scheduling through the showgroundslive.com software. Courses are produced on the PBIEC.coth.com website under the competitors tab each evening before the scheduled classes. Please use these tools to minimize your time on the show grounds each day.
